## Instructions for making a standard-size pillowcase:

Supplies:

- 3/4 yard fabric for the body
- 1/3 yard fabric for the border

Instructions:

1. Cut body of the case 26 1/2" x 40 1/2"
2. Cut border 10 1/2" x 40 1/2"
3. Fold border in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together and iron
4. Place the right side of the border on the right side of the body
5. Stitch these together using a 1/2" seam allowance
6. Place right sides together and stitch down sides and across bottom
7. Turn right-side-out and iron
8. Wash the pillowcase thoroughly (to sanitize for hospital use)
9. Place each pillowcase in an individual quart-sized ziplock bag
10. Contact your local coordinator to find a drop-off location
